During the seminar, the students also visited

the Museum of the Second World War and the European Solidarity Center.

Danish, German and Polish students also worked together on a project, where they analyzed primary sources from Bogdan Borusewicz's personal collection. The students' collective work will complete the exhibition on Martial Law that will be presented in the Faculty of History at the University of Gdańsk in early December 2021.
